Clifford William Anker, born in Cedar City Utah July 8th 1947 passed away unexpectedly the afternoon of Sunday, July 26th 2020. He resided in Keller, TX with his wife, son and grand-daughter. A native of Southern Utah, Clifford Graduated from Southern Utah University with a degree in Business Administration. In the 1970s, he served in the US Army during the Vietnam War era, spending time in South Korea as a specialist for the Hawk Missile Battalion.

He was always willing to help anyone in need, and his altruistic spirit, and unconditional love will be remembered and honored in those who were close with him, including the 9 children he helped raise.

Cliff will be cremated, and will spend his eternal rest in the national cemetery Columbarium in Grand Prairie, Texas. He will be forever loved and deeply missed by all who knew him. We love you, Papa.
